### Units & sensible drinking guidelines

The UK government's advice for sensible drinking is not to regularly exceed more than 3-4 units per day for men and 2-3 units per day for women. They define binge drinking as consuming over 8 units a day for men and over 6 units a day for women.

Most measurements of drinking patterns are unit-based. In the UK, a unit is defined as 8g of alcohol. This is equivalent to:



*A half pint of ordinary strength beer*



*125ml (a small glass) of wine  
(at 9% strength)*



*One 25ml measure of spirits*
